A 19th century Scottish mahogany longcase clock with eight day movement striking on a bell, the 12-inch square brass breakarch dial with silvered chapter ring framing a floral engraved centre with silvered subsidiary seconds and date aperture, all beneath a silvered boss to arch, inscribed 'John MacRae Glasgow', the hood with moulded arch pediment, reeded columns and glazed door, the arched trunk door with crossbanding, on a similarly decorated base and bracket feet, height 215cm, with pendulum and two weights.

Estimate: £200 - £300

Condition Report

1149. The clock is in generally good condition. The seatboard and cheeks are significantly padded to align the dial/movement, which would suggest the case and movement did not start life together. The case has typical minor splits to veneers and the trunk door is warped, but still closes and locks. The dial is in generally good clean order and movement appears to be ok and should run with a clean/refurbish but please be aware we give no guarantees to working order or reliability of any clock or watch.

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
