A Chinese gilt and polychrome painted carved wood figure of a dignitary, late Qing dynasty, seated on a throne, height 19cm (faults), together with two carved and pierced giltwood and red painted panels, a similar fragment, two crackle glazed vases,

### Condition Report

1023. Gilt-wood figure - some loss to gesso and other chips and splits to wood. Typical wear to paintwork.  
Panels - figural panel piercing in generally good order with some minor chips and losses, one side of the outer frame has been broken and repaired. The floral panel is in generally good condition with typical surface wear and minor surface splits to red lacquer. The fragment is part of a larger panel, but in generally good condition with minor chips and wear.

Small crackle glaze vase - 3cm hairline crack to rim only visible to interior, otherwise in good condition.

Larger crackle glaze vase - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Jar and cover - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Celadon Vase - 1 by 4cm section of rim broken away and missing, otherwise in generally good condition.
