Condition Report

1027. Satsuma jar and cover - typical overall fine crazing to glaze, generally in good condition with no significant damage, but wear to gilt and enamels. Two small hairline cracks to rim, each approx 1.5cm long. Satsuma dish - typical overall fine crazing to glaze, otherwise in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Cloisonné dish - starcrack to turquoise ground covering an area approx 5 by 5cm - please see the extra images on our website using the zoom function. There are a couple of very minor stress hairlines to the rim.
