### LOT 1042

A Chinese Canton blue and white export porcelain tankard, late 19th century, the cylindrical body painted with pagodas and pavilions in a coastal landscape, height 12.3cm, together with a blue and white export porcelain and barrel-shaped mug, late Qi

Estimate: £80 - £120

### Condition Report

1042. Tankard - fritted chips to side edges of handle, otherwise in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Barrel shaped mug - long haircrack running from rim to lower handle terminal where it branches in 2 directions, one towards footrim and the other behind the handle, with two minor unsprung chips along its length.

Pair two-handled cups - first has crack to one upper handle terminal, 8mm by 2mm chip to exterior rim edge with two 1.5cm long vertical haircracks to the rim and a couple of minuscule nicks to the rim. The other is in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, just a spot of fritted glaze loss to one handle lower terminal.

Coffee cup - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. Typical rubbing to gilding.
