Two Chinese blue and white porcelain circular bowls, Ming dynasty, each exterior painted with scrolling tendrils, diameters 13.9cm and 14.5cm (cracked), with wood stands, together with a blue and white porcelain jarlet, height 5cm.

Estimate: £80 - £120

Condition Report

1043. Bowl one - approx 1.5cm long vertical haircrack to rim, a vertical hairline visible to the bowl exterior running from the footrim to the top rim edge running through a firing blemish - not visible to the interior - and another horizontal hairline approx 14cm long to the bowl exterior emanating from a small firing blemish. Extensive fritting/chips to both the top rim and footrim with noticeable surface scratches to the interior and exterior.

Bowl two - approx 10cm long haircrack to base visible to interior and exterior. Significant chipping/frits to footrim. Tiny filled/restored spot to top rim edge with some minor fritting. Number of manufacturer's blemishes to glaze which is quite scratched/worn overall.

Stands - one with small loss to scroll carving, otherwise ok.

Jarlet - small chip to inner edge of footrim, otherwise ok.
