An impressive pair of Chinese blue and crackle glazed porcelain vases, late Qing dynasty, each of baluster form with flared neck, the blue glazed body and neck moulded in low relief and painted with playful Buddhist lion cubs, brocade balls and vap

Condition Report

1050. Vase One - in generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs, tiny chip to underside of rim approx 0.2 by 0.3cm.

Vase Two - U-shaped section of rim broken in 2 pieces and re-glued, approx 2 by 6.5cm, an associated hairline crack approx 11cm long running vertically. The upper iron oxide collar with 2 chips. One handle broken into 4 pieces and repaired. The rest of the body in good condition.
