A Chinese turquoise glazed porcelain vase, late Qing period, of baluster form, height 29cm, the foot and rim with brass table lamp mounts, together with a group of mostly Chinese blue and white export porcelain, a Canton teapot and two English bowls

Condition Report

1062. Turquoise glaze vase - appears to be in generally good condition, obviously converted to a table lamp with hole drilled to base, typical light surface scratches and wear and slight staining to glaze.

Blue and white prunus vase and cover - chip and crack to rim, and minor chips to finial of cover.

Two prunus ginger jars - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Large blue and white jar and cover - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Canton teapot - missing lid, broken and repaired section of rim, one handle mount repaired, wear to gilt and enamels.

Japanese blue and white teapot - crack to one handle mount, otherwise generally in good condition.

Larger English bowl - chip to rim, otherwise ok.

Smaller English bowl - 2 chips to footrim, typical wear and surface scratches to interior.
