A Chinese export porcelain part tea service, late Qianlong period, painted with gilt overlaid cobalt blue urns, comprising a teapot and cover with fruit finial, a helmet-shaped jug, a two-handled sugar bowl, a slop bowl, a smaller bowl and a pair of

Condition Report

1064. Teapot - visible rivet repairs to handle, horizontal haircrack running above footrim from beneath urn on one side to spout terminal where it branches into a number of haircracks radiating around where the spout joins the body. 1cm long by 0.5cm chip to top rim edge. Cover has a few chips to the inner flange and some minor nicks around the air hole. The gilt knob is rubbed, the decoration otherwise is good.

Jug - visible repairs to handle, otherwise in good condition with bright decoration.

Two handled bowl - missing cover, 5cm long vertical haircrack to rim running alongside one of the urns, light wear to gilding.

Large bowl - 4cm long vertical haircrack to rim and overall minor nicks/chips to top rim edge where the gilding is also rubbed, gilding worn to base interior. 3cm long hairline visible to base underside.

Small bowl - starcrack to base, minor chip to outer rim edge. Gilding worn to base interior and rim.

Two cups - one with 2.5cm long vertical hairline to rim by handle, other with 4cm long vertical haircrack through urn decoration, both with wear to gilt rims.

Two saucers - both with significant wear to decoration. One with 2.5cm haircrack to rim.
