### LOT 1081

A Chinese blue and white porcelain circular dish, Kangxi period, the central panel painted with three fishermen seated at the shore side in a coastal landscape, the rim filled with four fish and weeds, diameter 27.7cm (repair to rim), together with t

Estimate: £150 - £250

### Condition Report

1081. Dish with central figural landscape - a 3cm deep by 6cm long triangular shaped section has been broken out of the rim at 4 o'clock and visibly glued, there is an associated 3cm long haircrack running from it. Extensive typical fritting to the rim circumference and footrim. Overall typical light surface scratches. Some light crazing visible to well of plate.

Plate with central crab - 4cm haircrack to rim, 1cm by 0.8cm chip to rim underside with a similar smaller flat chip to rim upper edge which overall has typical fritting/nicks. Typical light surface scratches.

Plate with segmented landscape panels - 1.2cm by 0.4cm chip to rim underside with a number of other smaller chips and fritting to the rim circumference, one slightly more noticeable to upper rim edge 1cm by 0.4cm.

Minor and light typical surface scratches.

Dish with wave rim border - 1.4cm by 0.4cm chip to rim edge with associated 3cm vertical haircrack. There are 3 other similar but smaller chips and haircracks to the rim. Typical overall fritting to rim otherwise. Very light surface scratches to glaze.
