A near pair of Sino-Tibetan brass, copper and cloisonné enamel ceremonial water vessels (kundika), probably late Qing dynasty, each with graduated three-tier knop neck above a cloisonné globular body, decorated with polychrome mythical beasts on a tu

Estimate: £200 - £400

Condition Report

1230. Vessel one - generally in good condition with no significant damage or repair, but with some misshaping to the knops and neck, the hinged lid to the filling aperture is very wobbly. Overall typical surface wear and scratches but cloisonné in generally good order.

Vessel two - similar condition to first vessel, but cloisonné bulbous body has been pushed down slightly causing a hairline crack to its underside.
