Condition Report

335. Generally in good sound condition. Typical light surface scratches and wear. Few minor dents to body but no significant damage or repairs. Good crisp decoration. No inscriptions or erasures. Good clear hallmarks. Interior is a little dirty and would benefit from a clean.

Length of bowl from end of handle to handle is 43cm.

Width of bowl rim is 22.7cm.
