A Meissen potpourri vase and pierced cover, late 19th century, the baluster body painted with two maidens in a garden setting opposing a floral bouquet, each within a high relief frame of fruit and flowers flanked by foliate handles, the circular foot surmounted by two putti, the cover with floral arrangement finial, crossed swords in underglaze blue to base with incised shape No. 2711, height 35cm (faults and losses).

Estimate: £120 - £180

Condition Report

1499. Structurally the vase is in good condition overall with no significant damage; one of the handles has a break to the foliate tip but the piece is available with the lot and has signs of an old glue repair. The other handle is missing the tip of one foliate section. Otherwise the applied flowers and foliage have typical minor chips and losses, nothing terribly noticeable. The putti are in good condition.

The cover itself is in good condition, the floral finial has chips, losses and old restoration - there are two loose flowers available with the lot.
