### LOT 411

A pair of Edwardian silver and mother-of-pearl knife rests, each with a pair of carved mother-of-pearl wings on a silver hexagonal weighted base, Sheffield 1908 by James Dixon & Sons, height 4.5cm, cased, together with a pair of silver napkin rings with engine turned decoration, Birmingham 1962, a silver vesta case, a small group of other silver items and a green glass double-ended scent bottle with brass hinged lids.

Estimate: £100 - £150

### Condition Report

411. Both knife rests appear to be in good condition with no significant damage or repairs. Mother-of-pearl with no chips or crack. Typical light wear to bases. Fitted case in poor condition.

Pair of napkin rings slightly misshapen, otherwise ok. Vacant cartouche.

Octagonal napkin ring - good condition, minor misshaping. Engraved monogram.

Pepper - misshapen foot, few minor dents and typical wear.

Heart shaped pin dish - good condition, engraved initial and dated.

Embossed dish - few minor dents to base and side, otherwise ok.

Vesta - bit worn and tired, hinge ok.

Double ended bottle - glass with minor nicks, wear and scratches. Both brass ends are damaged, one of which significantly so, split and losses.

Button hook - scratched and dented.

Brush - typical wear, scratches and minor dents to silver.
