A Minton porcelain Coalbrookdale floral encrusted plate, mid-19th century, piled high with an arrangement of fruit and flowers within a pierced gilt edged rim, crossed swords mark in underglaze blue to base, diameter 20cm (faults). Note: the design for this 'Perforated plate' is illustrated by Geoffrey Godden, 'Coalport & Coalbrookdale Porcelains', p.308, pl. 235 A.

Condition Report

The delicate and intricate nature of this piece means it is very difficult to handle and inspect fully, especially to view the underside - basically though there are at least 2 large and long open haircracks to the underside (probably a manufacturing issue) and a number of other haircracks, associated with these issues are a number of repairs to the pierced rim, these include one notable area and a number of other smaller areas - primarily visible to the underside but also noticeable to the upper edge. It does seem a little unstable.

The relief flowers, fruit and foliage have the typical losses and chips you would expect, to varying degrees, some loose pieces are available with the lot. Please see the extra images on our website using the zoom function.
