LOT 1494

A Meissen circular jar and cover, 19th century, the white glazed body with basketweave moulded rims, painted with purple flowers and green leaves, the cover with floral finial, crossed swords in underglaze blue to base, diameter 14.5cm (faults), together with a group of ceramics, including a French breakfast cup and saucer, a Continental teabowl and saucer and a gilt ground Vienna coffee can and saucer (faults).

Condition Report

Meissen jar and cover - the jar is in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. The cover has a 1.5cm long by 0.4cm chip to the rim edge, and 2 smaller chips to the edge; there is also a 7cm long haircrack running beneath the floral finial which has some minor chips to the petals and a small loss to the stem, otherwise has typical surface scratches and light wear to the gilding.

French breakfast cup and saucer - In good condition overall with no chips or restoration, there is a 2.5cm faint hairline to the rim edge of the saucer, only noticeable on close inspection.

Teabowl and saucer - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. A few light and minor surface scratches.

Gilt ground Vienna coffee can and saucer - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. There is a noticeable spot of wear to the upper surface of the saucer and the gilt ground does show the surface scratches overall but isn't untoward.

Turquoise and gilt teacup and saucer - starcrack, haircrack and chip to saucer, chip to rim of cup which is inscribed 'Boyer' to underside.

Chinese Imari plate - badly cracked and chipped.

Japanese Imari dish - typical light wear/rubbing but in good condition overall.
