A 19th century mahogany chamber table, in the manner of Gillows of Lancaster, the top with a hinged pen and ink compartment, fitted with a single frieze drawer, on reeded tapering legs, height 74cm, width 61.5cm, depth 45.5cm. Note: a similar table design can be seen in 'Gillows of Lancaster and London 1730-1840' by Susan E. Stuart, page 300.

Condition Report

2090. Structurally sound but with some slight gaps to the leg/frieze joints. The top has a splash of stripped off polish and some overall surface wear, scuffs and bumps. The 'removable' pen tray to the top compartment is currently jammed in place. The drawer has a strip of cock beading missing to left front edge. There are chips to the lower turnings on the left front and rear legs.
