LOT 1514

A Minton porcelain cabinet plate, circa 1870, painted with a central bird, the turquoise rim with gilt framed bird panels and floral detail, impressed mark to base, diameter 23.5cm, together with a similar cabinet plate, probably Minton, enamelled with a bird perched above fruit, the turquoise rim with floral and bird panels, a Mintons posy holder in the form of two conjoined pails, and a Coalbrookdale cup, cover and stand (faults).

Estimate: £60 - £100

Condition Report

Minton Plate - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. Light typical surface scratches visible to white ground area when held in right light.

Probably Minton plate - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. Some minor stacking wear and rubbing to gilt rim.

Conjoined pails - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Cup, cover and stand - the cover is a matched Continental porcelain replacement. Otherwise the cup and stand have typical fine crazing to the glaze with 2 minor hairlines visible to the base interior of the cup which are just visible to the exterior. There are also 2 minor hairlines amidst the crazing to the rim of the cup. The applied flowers and foliage have typical minor losses/chips.
