### LOT 1502

A pair of Meissen porcelain figures, late 19th century, modelled as a seated boy and girl raised on pierced bases, crossed swords in underglaze blue to bases with incised model No. 'C.28', height 12.5cm (faults and losses), together with a diminutive Meissen porcelain figure of a lady ice skater, a diminutive Berlin porcelain figure of a boy begging, a Frankenthal porcelain figure of a vintner and two pairs of Sitzendorf figures (faults).

Estimate: £200 - £300

### Condition Report

1502. Meissen girl - losses to yellow bow, edges of lace dress and purple ribbon.

Meissen boy - missing right hand, missing handle of sword, losses to flowers.

Meissen ice skater - tiny nick to right hand, minor losses to enamel decoration.

Berlin beggar boy - chip to right hand thumb, losses to back.

Sitzendorf pink/yellow figures. Man - losses to pipe, base and frilled cuffs. Girl - losses to fingers on both hands and to base.

Vintner - missing item held in right hand. Chips/losses to enamel decoration. Chips to fingers holding grapes.

Sitzendorf floral figures. Man - chip to finger and losses to frills on jacket. Lady - losses to frills on corset.

The figures are otherwise in generally good condition.
