### LOT 1419

A Derby and Bloor Derby part service, circa 1820, painted with purple and gilt acanthus leaf scrollwork, comprising teapot, cover and stand, sucrier and cover, jug, slop bowl, two plates, eight teacups, seven coffee cans and ten saucers, red printed and purple painted factory marks (faults, losses and repairs).

Estimate: £60 - £100

### Condition Report

Teapot - crazed, missing end of spout with signs of old rivet repairs here, haircrack to lower handle terminal, fine haircrack to flange where cover sits, cover ok.

Teapot stand - crazed with wear and fine hairline to rim.

2 dishes - both crazed, one with short hairline to rim.

Sucrier and cover - crazed, both handles rivet repaired.

Jug - crazed, small chip to spout.

Slop - crazed with minor staining to base interior.

Cans - each crazed, one with fine vertical haircrack, one with glued handle and cracked, one with riveted handle.

Cups - majority crazed, 3 with indistinct haircracks, 1 with tiny nick to rim and associated short hairline.

Saucers - 3 with some crazing.
