LOT 1509

A pair of Chamberlains Worcester porcelain beakers, early 19th century, of flared shape, each painted with a titled scene 'A View in the Grounds at Dudmaston', against a gilt vermicule ground, black script mark to bases, height 8.8cm (both restored), together with an English porcelain basket with floral encrusted rim, painted with a continuous landscape, and a similar square plate.

Estimate: £50 - £100

Condition Report

First beaker - 2 professionally restored vertical cracks running length of body, one through middle of painted panel, the other almost opposite through the gilt vermicule ground. Indistinct starcrack to base.

Second beaker - in similar condition with 2 professionally restored vertical cracks to body, one to middle of painted panel, the other to its right outer edge, extensive associated overpainting to beaker interior.

Basket - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. Probably lacking a cover, typical losses/chips to applied flowers/foilage, some minor short vertical hairlines to underside edge of rim.

Plate - small chip to footrim, otherwise in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. Some stacking wear, gilt rim rubbed.
