### LOT 1478

A small group of decorative ceramics, late 18th century and later, including an English creamware oval plate, blue painted with chinoiserie decoration, length 38.5cm, a spongeware oval serving dish, probably Scottish, painted with a floral border, length 37cm, and a Staffordshire figure of a shepherd carrying a lamb over his shoulder before bocage (faults).

Estimate: £50 - £80

### Condition Report

1478. Creamware oval dish - hairline crack to rim. Some staining to rim most noticeable on the reverse.

Typical chipping to glaze on rim and surface wear.

Spongeware dish - overall heavily crazed, with staining. Small chip to rim.

Shepherd - missing a portion of his staff. Small losses to enamel on hat and trousers. Small losses to bocage and base. Generally in good condition for age.

Woman - right had detached but present. Restoration to right side of bocage with some small losses. Missing portion of broom. Overall crazing.

Berry pot and cover - a few small areas of restoration to the very edges of the leaf. Overall crazing. Otherwise in generally good condition.

Miniature jug - minor losses to blue enamel decoration, otherwise ok.

Minton cups and saucers - one cup cracked and chipped. Other pieces ok.

Creamware oval dish - some areas of restoration/repainting to the rim.
