A pair of Chinese famille rose porcelain vases, late 19th century, each shouldered ovoid body painted with opposing figural panels, reserved against a ground of flowers and foliage, beneath a similarly decorated flared neck, applied with chilong to shoulders and Buddhistic lion handles, unmarked, height 25.7cm.

Estimate: £100 - £150

Condition Report

1014. Both vases in generally good condition with good vibrant decoration.

Vase 1) generally good condition, no significant damage or repairs. Small chip and scuff to glaze on rim, and a few glaze scuffs to highpoints of chilongs on shoulders. Typical light surface scratches and wear.

Vase 2) generally good order with no significant damage or repairs. Typical light wear and surface scratches. One side of the neck and shoulder has been misfired with some minor pitting and a more matt finish, rather than the usual glossy glaze, but no restoration.
