A Japanese inlaid wood tonkotsu (tobacco box), Meiji period, of oval form, the sides and cover inlaid with crabs and a blossoming branch, one side with carved signature plaque, height 6cm, length 9cm, the drawstring fitted with signed ojime, and a carved and pierced stained ivory circular netsuke, diameter 4cm, together with a Japanese Shibayama inlaid ivory rectangular coin box and cover, length 4.7cm.

Estimate: £150 - £250

Condition Report

1050. Tonkotsu - generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs. Typical light surface wear, but no splits or cracks to wood and all inlay is present. There are some minor scuffs and scratches to edges of the wood case.

Ojime and netsuke - in good condition.

Ivory box - generally good order, no significant damage or repairs.
