A collection of nine Japanese cloisonné pieces, Meiji period, comprising an ovoid vase, decorated with a dragon on a blue ground, height 9cm, a ginbari hexagonal slender baluster vase by Ota Hyozo, decorated with flowers on a red foil backed ground, two-character mark to base, height 18.3cm, five other vases, heights ranging from 11.6cm to 30.5cm, and two turquoise ground dishes, diameter and width approx 18cm (faults).

Condition Report

1151. Ota Hyozo vase - there are bruises/hairlines to one of the facets, covering approximately 3.5cm x 1cm in area, with some minor chipping around the edges. There is a small star hairline just below the shoulder, each hairline approximately 1.5cm. There are also bruises, chips to four of the shoulder corners. There is also chips, hairlines/bruises around the foot.

Blue dragon ovoid vase - generally good condition. Two small chips to blue enamel just above the dragon's head and very small chip to underside of rim beneath the metal rim.

Small pale green vase - two small chips/bruises to shoulder. Two chips and hairlines near to the base, otherwise ok.

Blue ginbari dragon - no significant damage, but some minor bruises and faint hairlines to shoulder. Couple of other small chips/bruises to lower section of dark blue enamel and a small chip/bruise to reverse of vase, surface scratches.

Black ovoid vase - large dent, chips and poor repair to lower section of vase, approximately 5cm x 2cm, and typical surface scratches and wear.

Hexagonal vase - misshapen rim and missing its metal rim mount, some minor losses and chips to enamel on neck, otherwise the body appears to be in generally good condition with only typical wear and scratches. Larger vase - hairline cracks to neck, chip to neck and large star crack with numerous hairlines to side of body, also a chip to body and other small hairlines.

Petal dish - hairlines to lower right petal and typical wear.

Circular dish - numerous hairlines all over and some repairs to underside.
