A pair of Chinese famille rose enamelled porcelain planters, mark of Qianlong but early 20th century/Republic period, each of slightly tapered rectangular form, the sides painted with precious objects and flowers, iron red enamelled six-character mark to bases, height 11.3cm, length 17.5cm (one cracked), together with a pair of hardwood stands, each rectangular panelled top above a pierced and carved scroll apron, on shouldered square legs united by shaped stretchers, total height of planters and stands 33.5cm.

Estimate: £500 - £800

Condition Report

1150. One is in very good condition with no chips, cracks or repairs. The other has a hairline crack starting in one lower corner and running diagonally for approximately 15cm. Also starting in the same corner there is a 12cm vertical crack which runs over the rim and a 12.5cm hairline running across the base. Otherwise both have fresh vibrant enamels and gilt.

Both stands are in good order with only typical minor wear etc.
