### LOT 321

A George III silver caddy shovel with turned mother-of-pearl handle, Birmingham 1810 by Joseph Willmore, length 8.7cm, together with a small group of other silver items, comprising a small novelty pepper caster of milk churn form, Birmingham 1890, height 3.5cm, a silver vesta case, Birmingham 1875 by George Unite, a silver and mother-of-pearl child's rattle, a silver bookmark with thistle finial, London 1895 by Sampson Mordan & Co, and a later silver bookmark.

### Condition Report

321. Caddy shovel - good condition with no significant damage or repairs. Good clear hallmarks. Mother-of-pearl handle in good order.

Pepper - few minor dents, but otherwise good. Good clear marks.

Vesta - typical light wear and some minor dents/misshaping. Sprung hinge is good and closes tightly. Good clear marks.

Thistle page marker - minor misshaping and wear to blade. Minor rubbing to hallmarks, but readable.

Modern owl page marker - good condition.

Rattle - some dents to spiral fluted ball and marks a bit rubbed. Handle ok.
