A George III ebonized bracket clock with eight day twin fusee movement striking hours on a bell, the backplate with engraved border and inscribed 'John Brown London', the painted circular 7-inch dial with black Roman hour numerals, the arched case with pad top and brass carrying handle, above pierced brass scale fret panels to front door and sides, on a moulded rectangular plinth base and brass bracket feet, height 43cm, with pendulum, winding key and case key.

Estimate: £800 - £1,200

Condition Report

1145. The clock is in generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs. The case has typical splits to veneers particularly to the arched top and sides. The case is a bit dusty and dirty and would benefit from a clean.

The movement winds and is currently running and the strike mechanism is working, but please be aware we give no guarantees to working order or reliability of any clock or watch.

Please be aware, the bell is a later replacement.

The dial has been repainted and has a few minor marks, the most noticeable of them at 10 o'clock.

Two of the brass feet are ever so slightly wobbly so would need fully securing. Hinges and doors are good.

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
