LOT 1160

A George III figured mahogany longcase clock with eight day movement striking on a bell, the 12-inch brass breakarch dial with silvered subsidiary strike/silent dial to arch above a silvered chapter ring with black Roman hour numerals and outer Arabic minutes, framing a matt centre with recessed silvered subsidiary seconds, date aperture and applied silvered plaque, inscribed 'Allam & Clements, London', the hood with pagoda top and brass finials above a moulded arch pediment and glazed door, flanked by a pair of brass stop-fluted columns, the trunk with arch door, on a panelled base and plinth, height 251cm, with pendulum, two weights and case key. Note: the partnership of Allam and Clements is recorded between 1764 and 1795, working out of their premises at 119 Bond Street, London.

Estimate: £1,500 - £2,500

Condition Report

1160. The oak seat board has three nail holes to each side. There are no nail holes to the cheeks of the case. There has been restoration to the hood and the case. One of the brass capitals is missing to one of the rear columns on the hood, some old cracks to the hood. The suspension hook is missing from the pendulum, so unable to test the movement. There are additional wooden supports on the inside of the cheeks with glue stains around them. The chapter ring has light surface scratch/cleaning marks. This clock came from a local deceased estate and has been in the family for a number of years.

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
