A Michael Cardew Winchcombe studio pottery teapot, circa 1929, decorated in a honey glaze, inscribed 'S.S. Pulteney' and with the date '1929', impressed marks to base, height 18cm (some glaze flaking), together with a handwritten letter by Michael Cardew, dated '12 Nov 1970', the teapot having been made by him for the captain of the S.S. Pulteney, which he had sailed upon.

## Condition Report

1381. The body of the teapot is generally in good condition, no cracks or restoration. Glaze has overall crazing. there is some noticeable chipping to the glaze on the lid, mainly to the finial and edges of dome. Additional glaze chipping to the handle, between then 'L' and 'T' pf 'Pulteney, the tip of the spout, to the edges of the base and interior of the body. Couple of minor glaze manufacturing flaws to the lid.
