A Meissen two-handled écuëlle and cover, mid-18th century, the circular body painted with figural scenes of peasants at work and rest, flanked by scroll handles with relief foliate terminals, the similarly painted domed cover with strawberry finial, crossed swords mark in underglaze blue and impressed '3' to base, diameter across handles 14cm.

Estimate: £200 - £300

Condition Report

1456. The body of the écuëlle is in generally good condition with some typical wear/scuffs to glaze on rim, but no apparent chips or restoration. Handles in good condition. Few very minor typical chips to flowers either side of handles. Some minor chips to underside of footrim and one slightly bigger chip to footrim. Cover does not quite fit so possibly mismatched but painting seems comparable, otherwise minor chips to leaf of finial, but good condition.
