## LOT 1475

A Salt pearlware figure of 'ST Matthew', circa 1830, modelled standing before bocage, a scroll at his feet, on a tiled base, applied scroll mark to reverse, height 21 cm, together with five Staffordshire pottery figures, including Shakespeare and Garibaldi, height 38cm, and an organ grinder with monkey (some faults and restoration).

Estimate: £80 - £120

## Condition Report

1475. St Matthew - restoration to right hand, and long axe handle and bocage. Overall crazing.

'6 AM' figure 1 - firing crack to right arm and left leg, some crazing.

'6 AM' figure 2 - overall crazing, some enamel losses overall, and to hair in particular.

Man and monkey - hairline cracks to side.

Garibaldi - hairline cracks just below belt, crazed, large firing crack/fault to underside of base.

Shakespeare - restoration and overpainting to pillar. Poorly re-glued right arm, restoration to right hand. Re-glued head.

Overall figures have some losses to enamel decoration.
