### LOT 1563

A rare Wellington Battle of Waterloo commemorative pearlware jug, circa 1815, printed in reddish brown with an equestrian portrait of Wellington on the battlefield with other officers and numerous soldiers in a continuous scene, the neck titled 'WELLINGTON' to each side, height 10.5cm, together with a black printed pearlware jug, decorated with hunting scenes and inscribed 'W A C' beneath the spout, height 14.5cm (faults).

Estimate: £80 - £120

### Condition Report

1563. Wellington jug - generally good condition, but print is a little worn. No chips, cracks or repairs. Few minor glaze scuffs to spout, rim and handle. Wear to brown painted rim and handle details. Some surface scratches and wear.

Black printed jug - chip to rim near handle which has been restored and overpainted (approx 2.5cm in length), other minor re-touching to rim. On the opposite side of rim there are two hairlines near spout (approx 2.5cm and 2cm). Some staining/discolouration spots to base. Otherwise typical surface scratches and wear and some glaze scuffs to handle edges.
