A Samson porcelain Worcester style two-handled bowl with pierced cover and stand, late 19th/early 20th century, of oval form with pink and blue flowerheads against a lime green ground, the stand with Chinese style dragons and insects to the well, the branch handles with floral terminals, iron red painted mark to base, length of stand 26cm (minor faults), together with an English porcelain floral painted rectangular dish, circa 1820, raised on scroll feet, length 26cm.

Estimate: £50 - £80

Condition Report

1529. Basket, cover and stand with typical wear to enamels and gilt.

Basket has two hairline cracks visible to interior and underside, otherwise in generally good condition with some losses to a few of leaf tips.

Cover in good condition with only chips to the ends of seven leaves.

Stand has a hairline crack to rim and handle, otherwise generally good condition with chip to tip of one leaf.

The rectangular dish in generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs. It has typical wear to gilt and decoration, and some surface scratches to glaze. Some discolouration and staining to porcelain visible to the centre and some minor crazing. Also slightly wobbly on its feet.
