### LOT 1555

A group of Staffordshire pottery figures and groups, late 19th and early 20th century, including a pair of coloured equestrian figures, titled 'Victor Emmanuel' and 'Garibaldi', height 37cm, a cow and calf spill vase and a pair of greyhound pen holders, together with an early 19th century pearlware figure of Andromache and two Toby jugs and covers (faults and repairs).

Estimate: £80 - £120

### Condition Report

1555. Victor Emmanuel - body of horse broken/cracked and repaired.

Toby jug - chip to inside of hat, otherwise ok, minor chips to underside rim of cover.

Toby jug - repaired hat and chip to cover.

Prince of Wales - chip to back of base, otherwise in good order.

Garibaldi - good condition.

Cow group - small chip to horn of cow and some paint loss, otherwise ok.

Scottish figure group - good condition with only small chip to base edge.

Pair of greyhounds - one with missing front left paw and chip to right ear, other in generally good order with small hairline to back.

Figure and deer group - damaged and repaired.

Lady - generally good condition, some minor glaze scuffs to edges of base and nose, but no significant damage or repairs.
