An Ashworth & Bros ironstone china part dinner service, late 19th century, decorated with chinoiserie panels against a green ground, comprising a large oval platter, length 53cm, two smaller graduated platters, a soup tureen, cover and stand, a sauceboat and eight dinner plates, printed and impressed marks to base (some faults).

Estimate: £100 - £200

Condition Report

1663. Generally the decoration is in good order with minor wear and scratches to enamels and gilt, the wear is more pronounced to the orange washed rims than the rest of the decoration.

Large tureen - 8cm hairline horizontal body crack to the side of the tureen. The cover has a crack running from ladle recess and across, approx 12cm long. The stand is in good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Some scratches to underside.

Sauce tureen - 8cm hairline to rim and cover has been broken in half and rivet repaired.

6 dinner plates - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs.

1 dinner plate - small chip to rim, otherwise ok.

1 dinner plate - very small chip to rim, but in manufacture and glazed over.

Large platter - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs.

2 smaller platters - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs.
