A pair of Meissen candlesticks, 19th century, modelled after Leuteritz as a triangular stem hung with laurel wreaths from putti heads beneath lilac ground silhouette panels, the stepped circular bases with laurel garlands over panels of putti, heightened overall in gilding with turquoise and pink enamels, the sconces with floral encrusted detail, underglaze blue crossed swords marks and incised shape No. 61 to bases, height 31 cm (faults and repairs).

Estimate: £400 - £600

Condition Report

1446. Candlestick 1 - 4cm vertical hairline crack to sconce. Wear to gilt on rim. Typical minor chips to flower encrusting. Column in good condition. Few minor chips to the laurel wreaths on the circular base and one turquoise leaf scroll repaired. Six small chips to gilt footrim.

Candlestick 2 - sconce has been broken and re-glued. Also some wear to gilt and chips to flower encrusting. Column in generally good condition with chip to corner of its base. At this point there is also a turquoise leaf scroll broken and missing. Two other turquoise scrolls are chipped and another is broken and repaired. One of the square medallions on the base has a chip to bottom left corner, another has some wear to lower left corner. One small chip to footrim.
