### LOT 1472

A small group of pottery and porcelain, 19th and 20th century, including a Barr Worcester saucer and two teacups, painted and gilt with serpents in Japan colours (saucer riveted), a green ground English slop bowl, a diminutive Royal Worcester blue printed leaf moulded jug and a Meissen puce painted shell shaped trinket dish (some faults).

Estimate: £40 - £60

### Condition Report

1472. 2 Barr cups - 1 good, the other with hairline crack, saucer is rivet repaired.

Blue jug - crack to rim and crazed.

Deco jug - small chip to footrim, typical light surface wear, otherwise good.

Slop bowl - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical light wear and scratches to interior.

Brown printed pale green cream jug - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs.

Lilac and white jug - generally ok, but typical surface wear and staining to glaze on rim, handle and down mould seam.

Octagonal jug - generally ok, but some light crazing and glaze staining.

Bulbous jug - star crack to base, otherwise ok.

Teapot and cover - good condition.

Silver overlay brown jug - good condition, but no lid.

Small cream jug - good condition, minor glaze staining.

Royal Worcester blue and white cream jug - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs.

Bun shaped paperweight - good condition.

Streaky glazed dish - good condition.

Meissen shell dish - good condition, minor wear to gilt.

2 small circular pottery wall plaques - good condition, some wear and minor loss to enamels.

Floral decorated cup and saucer - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical light wear to gilt and enamels.

2 porcelain cups - good condition, no chip, cracks or repairs.
