A Barr Worcester part service, circa 1790s, painted with a band of burgundy and gilt foliate scrollwork, comprising five teacups and seven saucers, jug, two-handled oval shaped bowl and a stand, together with an Etruscan shape English porcelain part service, early 19th century, and a small group of other porcelain (faults).

Condition Report

1431. Barr set:

5 cups in good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical light wear to gilt rims and minor surface scratches and wear.

Jug - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Minor wear to gilt.

2 handled-bowl - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Minor wear to gilt.

Stand - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs, but more substantial wear to gilt.

6 saucers - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Wear to gilt, particularly on rims.

1 saucer with chip and hairline to rim.

1 slop bowl cracked and chipped.

Other set:

5 coffee cups in good condition, typical light wear.

3 coffee cups in same condition, but with light staining and more obvious crazing.

2 coffee cups with cracks and staining.

Slop bowl with chip to rim and wear to gilt.

2 cake plates - both no chips, cracks or repairs, but wear to gilt.

6 saucers - no chips, cracks or repairs, but more significant wear to gilt and peach coloured ground.

2 saucers with hairlines.

4 teacups in good condition with no chips, cracks or repairs, and minor wear to gilt.

4 teacups - no chips, cracks or repairs, but wear to gilt.

1 teacup with crack and badly worn.

Other items:

Vase - damaged and repaired.

Boat shaped box - missing lid and integral stand cracked.

Hammersley dish - good condition.
