A French gold ring, circa 1900, decorated with a thoughtful cherub, marked, weight 0.7g, ring size approx M, a Victorian chalcedony small seal, a Victorian gilt metal oval pendant locket, glazed with a portrait photograph of a lady and a woven hair locket compartment, a gold stud, detailed '9ct', weight 1g, two citrine studs and two parts of earrings.

Condition Report



534. French ring  in generally good condition. It has French marks to the outside of the band.

Chalcedony seal  initial engraved, the mount is in good condition, in good condition overall.

Victorian locket  hinge in good condition. The locket is glazed with a portrait of lady and feather hair work spray, some of the wirework within the spray is broke away but present within the glass. Monogram engraved to the outside. The gilding of the suspension loop is rather rubbed. Otherwise in good condition.

Gold stud  good condition.

Citrine studs  have a few surface marks, particularly to one stud on the table facet. The citrine to one stud is slightly depressed within its setting. One stud appears to be smaller than the other, please note there are slight differences to the studs, which are not offered as a pair.

Amethyst and seed pearl drop  missing one seed pearl. Earring fitting  is missing its cultured pearl.

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
