A Chinese famille rose enamelled celadon glazed porcelain dish, late Qing dynasty, painted with a phoenix amidst peony within a wavy rim filled with Buddhistic emblems, indistinct red printed seal mark to base, diameter 24cm (small chip to rim), together with two similar leaf form bowls, painted and gilt with flowers and insects on a celadon ground, iron red painted four-character mark to bases, length 27.6cm and diameter 21cm (chips to rims).

Estimate: £60 - £100

Condition Report

1111. Dish with bird - small chip to rim and typical wear to enamels and gilt. Otherwise generally good order.

Oval bowl - glaze fritting/minor chips all around the rim. Otherwise no cracks or repairs. Wear to gilt and enamels and typical surface scratches to glaze.

Other bowl in similar condition with glaze fritting/minor chips to rim, no cracks or repairs. Wear to gilt and enamels and typical surface scratches.
