## LOT 1069

A group of Chinese Canton famille rose porcelain, mid-19th century, comprising a bottle vase, applied with dragon shoulders and gilt Buddhistic lion handles, height 24cm, larger vase, height 45cm, hexagonal jardinière and stand, height 17.5cm, a soap dish, cover and strainer, length 14.5cm, and a cylindrical box and cover, diameter 7.6cm (all with faults).

Estimate: £200 - £300

## Condition Report

1069. Large vase - broken into numerous pieces and rivet repaired.

Bottle vase - 1cm x 1.5cm chip to rim and a U-shaped section of rim broken out and re-glued (approx 3.5cm around rim x 3.5cm down at its deepest point). There is also a 4cm crack to the rim. Minor chips to the applied dragons, otherwise body of the vase in good condition.

Hexagonal planter and stand - broken into numerous pieces and repaired.

Cylindrical box and cover - chips to rims and edges, otherwise ok.

Soap box, cover and liner - cover broken in two and repaired with small chips to edge of crack. Box and liner in ok condition with no significant damage or repairs. Typical wear.
