A Chinese famille rose octagonal teabowl, late Qing dynasty, the exterior painted and gilt with two figures and rock opposing lines of black text and red seals, height 3.8cm (chip to rim), together with a Chinese Imari export porcelain teabowl, height 4cm, and a small group of Chinese blue and white porcelain (some faults).

Estimate: £60 - £100

Condition Report

1147. Octagonal tea bowl - small shallow chip across one corner of the bowl, otherwise good condition with no cracks or repairs. Decoration is good and vibrant.

Imari tea bowl - tiny chip to outside of rim, otherwise good condition, typical light wear and scratches.

Two blue and white beakers - both with 6cm hairline cracks to rims, one with small rim chip.

Blue and white cup - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs.

Two pairs of blue and white small tea bowls - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical surface scratches and wear, and some discolouration to glaze.
