A Chinese doucai porcelain circular dish, mark of Kangxi but late Qing dynasty, the interior painted with dragons and phoenix, underglaze blue six-character mark to base, diameter 13.5cm (minor rim chips), together with a Chinese iron red decorated porcelain saucer dish, mark of Qianlong but late Qing dynasty, painted in iron red and gilt with three fruit sprays, bats and shou character, underglaze blue pseudo seal mark to base, diameter 17.6cm (repair to rim).

Estimate: £150 - £250

Condition Report

1009. Small saucer - generally good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical light wear and surface scratches. Few minor glaze blemishes to rim.

Iron red decorated dish - hairline crack to rim (approx 3.5cm long) and section of rim to either side broken out in two pieces and re-glued. This repaired area is approx 5.5cm long and 2cm at its deepest point. There is also a 1.7cm long hairline crack further round the rim. Otherwise ok. Typical light wear to gilt and enamels.
