Condition Report

444. Flared base tankard - generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs. Typical light wear. Handle in good order with no repairs and not pushed in to body. Engraved initials. Good clear hallmarks.

Smaller tankard - slightly misshapen rim and dents to base rim, otherwise minor dents to body, typical light surface wear and engraved initials and date. Handle is good and not pushed in. Good clear hallmarks.
