An early Victorian silver gilt carriage timepiece, the eight day movement with platform escapement, the foliate engraved silvered circular dial with black Roman numerals above subsidiary day and date dials, the case with pierced scale pagoda top and crown surmount above a rosette band and four Corinthian corner columns, the sides inset with a pair of glazed panel mercury thermometers, the back with hinged door, on a plinth base, London 1839 by John Mortimer & John Samuel Hunt, stamped 'Mortimer & Hunt 218', height 16.5cm.

Condition Report

1170. The case is in generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs. It would, however, certainly benefit from a clean. Typical surface scratches and wear. Good clear hallmarks to base and part marks to other pieces of case.

Silvered dials in good order with only slight discolouration. All glass in good condition and back door closes tightly.

The movement does not wind or run. The hands adjust smoothly and day and date dials roll-over at correct times.

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
