## LOT 1255

A late Victorian carved oak bracket clock of architectural church form, with eight day triple fusee movement chiming on eight bells and striking hours on a gong, the foliate engraved silvered arch dial with black Roman hour numerals, the carved arched case with simulated tiled roof and brickwork, the sides with glazed window panels, the back with pierced fretwork door, height 58.5cm, with pendulum and winding key (minor faults).

## Condition Report

1255. The attractive case has nice quality carved decoration and is in generally good condition. Small section chipped to the front foot of the left hand column, otherwise only typical minor nicks etc. The pierced fret panel to back door has had a few minor repairs and the silk panel has deteriorated. Hinges to the back door are replacements and are a bit wobbly. The substantial brass movement is a little dirty. All three trains wind smoothly and the clock runs, but please be aware we give no guarantees to working order or reliability of any clock or watch. The strike and chiming mechanism also appear to be in good working order.
