LOT 390

A mid-19th century Maltese silver coffee pot, maker's mark Naudi, the baluster body with domed hinged cover and bud finial, raised on three hoof feet, hallmarks with maker's mark of Naudi to rim, weight 826g, height 24.5cm (handle broken and detached but present).

Estimate: £2,500 - £3,500

Condition Report

390. The silver itself appears to be in generally good condition commensurate with age.

There has been a small repair to the rim, with minor lead repair visible to the interior and a faint repair line visible to exterior (approx 4.3cm in length). There is also another lead repair to the other side of spout.

Otherwise typical light surface scratches and wear, but no other significant damage. Detail to shoulders of legs, legs and feet still good.

Hinge is good and cover closes with only a very small gape at front. Brass nut being used to secure the finial to the interior of the hinge cover is likely to be a replacement.

Hallmark to side of rim is good and clear and Maltese Cross mark to edge of cover slightly rubbed, but still clear.

As per description, the handle is broken and detached, but present.
