A George III silver argyle and cover, the tapered cylindrical body with engraved crest flanked by scroll spout and wood handle, on a beaded circular foot, London 1777, maker's mark indistinct, weight 324g, height 13.5cm.

Condition Report

350. The argyle is a little tired. There is a small area of repair to the front of the argyle just to the left above the engraved crest. This can be seen in the images on our website. The other side has a number of small dents and a small dent just to the left of the bottom joint of the handle. Otherwise typical surface scratches and wear with slight misshaping to inner rim of cover and slight misshaping to footrim. Handle is slightly wobbly but otherwise generally ok. Hallmarks to neck are rubbed. Part hallmarks to cover are good and clear. Ivory finial has a split to one side. Cover fits tightly as does the inner cover.
