LOT 1033

A Chinese famille rose porcelain bowl, late 19th century, of quatrelobed outline, the exterior painted with figures, vessels and lines of black text, length 24.5cm, together with a group of other Chinese famille rose porcelain, 18th century and later, including an export ware soup plate, Qianlong period, painted with a landscape, diameter 23cm, and a Canton vase, mid-19th century, typically painted with panels of figures, birds and flowers, height 24cm (some faults).

Condition Report

1033. Oval bowl - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical light surface scratches and wear. Small firing crack to footrim.

Famille rose vase - neck and rim restored and overpainted, some discolouration to interior, rest of body in good order.

Small Canton teapot - cover repaired. Teapot in good order, both with typical wear to enamels and gilt.

Other teapot - small chip to end of spout, firing crack to handle and wear to enamels.

Soup plate - 5.5cm long hairline to rim and a small chip to rim, otherwise in good order with typical wear and surface scratches to enamels and gilt.

Plate - section of rim broken out and re-glued, this two-piece section approx 8cm x 3.5cm. Also a 4cm and a 5.5cm hairline to the rim with a couple of tiny chips at the rim of hairline. Typical wear to enamels.
