### LOT 1254

A Wedgwood pearlware fish dish, early 19th century, of canted corner rectangular shape, relief moulded with two fish to the base interior, details picked out in blue, impressed uppercase mark to base, length 29.4cm, a similar smaller example, length 28.2cm, a pair of Wedgwood pearlware column candlesticks, height 19.2cm, and a similar pair of bud vases, height 11.5cm (faults and restoration).

Estimate: £150 - £250

### Condition Report

Double fish dish - no restoration or cracks, some minor fritting and chips to rim edge, some minor surface wear to raised detail on base interior.

Single fish dish - no restoration, 2 approx 2cm long fine vertical haircracks to rim which is fritted with significant loss of the blue enamel detail to the rim edge. The base interior fish has staining and some scratches.

Pair candlesticks - both with extensive professional restoration.

Pair vases - one with very minor professional restoration to tiny part of top rim edge, the other with similar professional restoration quite extensively to base edge and neck.
